Two amendments to the AS Articles of Incorporation will be included on Wednesday's election ballot.

The first one will read "Vote yes or no to strike out 'at large' in Section $\delta$ of the Articles of Incorporation, which now reads '13 representatives to the Student
Council of SDS chosen at large.'
The second one will read "Section 8, Articles of Incorporation, change the words 'Dean of Men at SDS and Dean of Women at SDS' to 'Dean of Activities at SDS and Activities Adviser at SDS.'

The passage of the firs amendment would make no change in current election
practices. at SDS. If the mendment were defeated ions would have to be conidered.,
As the provision now stands in the Articles of Incorpora ron, the manner of electing oficers is not stated definitely it is open to two interpreta trons. This fact came to the attention of the student body ast fall when former Graduate Representative Stan Stewart questioned the AS Council
as to the legality of election procedures here.
