## SDS Veteran Cites 37 Year Service

Freeman, five-time winner of the Silver Star and a sophomore here, served 37 years in the Marine Corps, enlisting in 1906. He retired in 1938, but went back during World War II.
The aggressive 67 -year-old saw action with the First Marines in China and then in Nicaragua. When World War I started, Freeman was stationed at Quantico Va., where he was a drill instruc-
tor. He was among the first to tor. He was among the first to be sent overseas.
For valor above and beyond the call of duty, Freeman was awarded the Presidential Citation and two purple hearts in the battles of Chateau-Tierre and Bellou Woods.
His hobbies include fishing mountain climbing, sailing, and reading. "I'm 67 years old now and $\mathrm{r}^{\prime \prime} l$ live to be a hundred or die trying," he said. "I am physically and mentally perfect and plan to stay that way for quite a while," he addled.
The partially bald, stocky ex
marine makes his home in Del Mar. He has been attending SDS ntermittenly since 1953. He takes only courses which interest him the most. "I've missed a lot of formal education during my life and I intend to make it up now, although I'm not planning to get degree," he said.
